





The biggest issue facing nonprofits in Hawaii, and how my organization is addressing it: One of the biggest issues is cost control. With the depressed economy over the past few years and the high cost of living in Hawaii, nonprofits must be vigilant in keeping their controllable costs down. The public can't afford to continue to contribute more and more for the nonprofit's services. Kauai Island Utility Cooperative has addressed cost control methodically and proactively by implementing these key practices: Re-evaluate the necessity for every position that becomes vacant to determine whether some or all of that position's functions can be better performed by another position or through automation, keep controllable cost increases at or below the level of inflation by scrutinizing the necessity of every item in the annual budget, and — this is a long-term process specific to the electric industry — aggressively pursue renewable-energy sources in order to lower energy costs, diversify our energy supply, and reduce our dependence on fossil fuels.

One thing that most people don't know about me: My love for dance, especially hula. Something about hula touches my very soul.
